1. PURPOSE OF THE WARDROBE

We have a uniform for a variety of reasons. A uniform fosters a sense of belonging, it helps us to represent the School within the community and it reduces the focus on what girls wear in comparison to others.

The Lowther Hall wardrobe seeks to be fit for the School environment, with different items for different age groups and different activities.

2. REQUIREMENTS

- All items must be clean in appearance. There should be enough items purchased to ensure a clean garment is worn to School each day.
- All items should be of an appropriate size for each student.
- Garments should be kept in good repair.
- The garments should be worn neatly.
- All items should be clearly named. It is recommended that student name tags be ironed or sewn on to each item/garment rather than written. Name labels should be on the **inside** of garments only.
- No visible items may be added to deal with changes in the weather. Families are expected to purchase a variety of items that have been designed for various Melbourne weather conditions.

The student body is divided into **four sections** as follows:

Blinkbonnie House	Kindergarten to Year 1
Raymond House	Year 2 to Year 6
Sampford House	Year 7 to Year 9
Grant House	Year 10 to Year 12

3. BLINKBONNIE HOUSE

Girls in Blinkbonnie House (Kindergarten to Year 1) have a unique range of garments to wear. These garments have been designed to enable students to move comfortably throughout the school day.

A list of Blinkbonnie House wardrobe items for students in Kindergarten to Year 1 is available in Appendix 1.

4. YEAR 2 TO YEAR 12 ACADEMIC WARDROBE

In Years 2 to 12, during a regular school day, and for the majority of classes, a trans-seasonal academic wardrobe is worn.

There is also a **Sports Range** for Physical Education and Sport and other specific sportswear items for various activities and competitions. On designated days, students may also be given permission to wear the Sports garments to and/or from school and to wear it to non-sport classes.

The **VCE “hoodie”** is designed each year by the Year 12 cohort, led by the School Captain. The design is approved by the School but the item is not part of the “official” wardrobe. The VCE “hoodie” is therefore not permitted to be combined with any other aspect of the Academic or Sport Wardrobes when **OUTSIDE THE SCHOOL GATE**.

Sometimes, special customised clothing may be arranged for a sport, team or activity. These items must always be approved by the School, via application to the Principal, prior to design and production.

4.1 BEYOND THE SCHOOL GATE

Girls are representing the School when out and about at the beginning and end of each day, whether this be as they wait to be collected, catch public transport, walk, visit the shops or simply get in or out of a car in the school drop-off zone. This is also the case when girls are on excursions or when Senior girls leave the premises during breaks.

At these times, the wardrobe should be presented in a complete state, with the blazer always worn.

The jumper or vest must never be worn as the outer garment at these times.

In warm temperatures during the middle or at the end of the day, the blazer may be removed and the shirt or dress worn as the visible garment. In Senior School (Years 7 to 12) girls will make this decision for themselves, and in Raymond House (Years 2 to 6) they will be directed by staff.

In Term 1 and Term 4 the formal hat should be worn outside the school gate when girls are not under cover.

On designated days, various groups of girls undertaking physical activities, may be given permission to wear sportswear to and/or from School.

The following must not be worn to and from school as part of the Sport Wardrobe:

- bike shorts
- skort
- competition specific items (eg netball dress)
- dance tights

4.2 ACADEMIC WARDROBE YEARS 2 TO 12

Items of the School's range of academic wardrobe coordinates are trans-seasonal and can be worn throughout the year.

Students together with their families can choose items from a range of garments that best reflects the individual's personality, daily needs and identity.

Girls are encouraged to select a range of items and to be confident in their personal preferences rather than thinking about what others might wear.



5. ACADEMIC WARDROBE RULES

The following rules apply:

- The blazer is always worn to school.
- The blazer is always worn on official occasions, including excursions, unless otherwise advised.
- The blazer is always worn home from school and when outside the School grounds. The only exception to this is when the temperature is extremely warm, in which case it may be removed and carried, leaving the shirt or dress as the top garment.
- The blazer is usually worn unbuttoned, unless otherwise advised.
- Badges can only be pinned to the lapels of the blazer and must be School related and approved.
- Jumpers or vests may not be worn outside the School as an outer garment and can only be worn under a blazer outside the School.
- Jumpers are not to be worn across the shoulders or tied around the waist.
- The Year 12 "hoodie" is not to be worn with any part of the School wardrobe outside the school grounds.

- Shorts should be no shorter than mid-thigh length.
- For some events and excursions, shorts may not be appropriate. Girls will be advised of such occasions in advance.
- Tights/stockings cannot be worn with the shorts.
- Pants should be no higher than the top of shoes and they should not touch the ground.
- Shirts may be tucked in or worn out. If they are worn out, they should sit at the hip bone. Girls whose shirts are too long will be required to tuck them in.
- The bottom edge of a shirt should not be visible when a blazer, jumper or vest is worn.
- In Terms 1 and 4 the formal hat must be worn at all times outside the School grounds whilst a student is not under cover.
- The hat and hat band should be well-presented and the hat should be worn so that the crest is front and centre of the band.
- On application to the Principal, a navy blue head scarf may be worn.
- Dresses and skirts should be no shorter than top of the knee length and no longer than the bottom of the knee.
- Undergarments, particularly sports bras, should be skin or light colored only so as to not be visible under any sports garment.
- Students are encouraged to wear sunglasses whenever they are outdoors, particularly during Terms 1 and 4. They may be worn to and from school, in the school grounds and for Physical Education classes and sport. Sunglass styles need to be approved by the Deputy Principal - Head of Senior School, Head of Raymond House or Head of Blinkbonnie House before they are worn as part of the uniform.
- Sport caps are not to be worn in non-sport classes unless specifically required.
- Shirt and dress collars must not be worn outside of the blazer (see right).



6. YEAR 2 TO YEAR 12 SPORTSWEAR (PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SPORT)

- The standard sportswear combination is required for all sports teams and competitors, unless otherwise advised by the Director of Sport.
- No sportswear items can be worn in conjunction with the academic wardrobe.
- No jewellery is to be worn during any sporting activities.
- White sport socks (without a logo) must cover the ankle bone and be no shorter or longer.
- In Raymond House, coloured House polo shirts are to be worn for House Sport lessons and special House Days only for girls who are in Years 4 to 6. These shirts may only be worn to and from school if they are covered by a zipped up sport jacket or rugby jumper and not visible as an outer garment, otherwise students must change into and out of their House polo shirt at school.
- In Senior School, coloured House polo shirts may be worn for House Swimming, House Athletics and on House Activities Day.
- On the days that Raymond House students are permitted to wear their sports garments to and from school, they may wear the optional sport leggings to and from school.
- All students are required to wear either the Bucket Hat (Kindergarten to Year 12) or the Sports Cap [Year 6 (Term 4 only) and Years 7 to 12] during outdoor Physical Education or Sports activities during Terms 1 and 4 between the hours of 11.00am and 3.00pm. Wearing a Bucket Hat or Sports Cap to school is not necessary and it can be stored in a locker so that it is available during the school day.
- The School visor is only permitted to be worn by Senior School students who are participating in rowing, tennis or triathlon programs. In rowing, this will be a crew by crew decision.

6.1 SPORTSWEAR - COMPULSORY

The School's sportswear must be worn for all Physical Education classes and Sport sessions. The range is designed to be mix'n'match so various combinations can be worn unless specific instructions are provided by the School staff for particular sports and/or activities.

A list of item requirements and wardrobe options is available in Appendices 3, 4 and 5.

6.2 SPORT SHOES

Runners need to be predominantly white, black, navy, pale blue or gold. Runners should support the foot and have non-marking soles. For examples of acceptable types of sport shoes, refer to Appendix 6.

7. SCHOOL BAG

A school bag is compulsory.

Year 2 to Year 5	Medium Chiropractic

8. SPORT BAGS

A sports bag is compulsory.

Year 2 and Year 3	Havasak Sports Bag
Year 4 to Year 12	Havasak Sports Bag and/or LH Olympic Sports Bag

No bags other than the official navy blue Havasak bag (and/or the LH Olympic sports bag for Year 4 upwards) should be taken to any sporting activities.

9. OTHER COMPULSORY BAGS

Year 2 and Year 3	Lowther Hall Home Reading Bag
Year 2 to Year 6	Lowther Hall Drawstring Library Bag
Year 4 to Year 12	Excursion / Examination Bag

10. BLACK SHOES

Year 2 to Year 6	Lace up with no coloured stitching OR Velcro with no coloured stitching and two Velcro straps
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Year 7 to Year 12	Lace up with no coloured stitching
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Please note that "Mary Jane" style and T-Bar shoes are **not** an option.

Doc Marten style shoes must have the yellow stitching covered with a black permanent marker or pen.

For examples of acceptable types of black school shoes, refer to Appendix 7.

11. FACE MASKS

The School follows government guidelines in relation to any wearing of face masks.

Students may wear either a disposable white or blue mask, plain white cloth mask, or the fabric Lowther Hall* mask.

* The non-surgical Lowther Hall masks are made in two sizes to comply with the Department of Health recommendations and have 3 layers comprised as follows:

Outer layer: water resistant (100% polyester microfibre fabric)
Middle layer: poly/cotton blend (65% polyester/35% cotton poplin fabric)
Inner layer: water absorbing fabric (100% cotton muslin)

They are machine washable and are available from our Wardrobe Supplier.

12. CARE AND LAUNDERING

Items should be well cared for and carefully stored. Students should be supported to fold, hang and handle garments in ways that will maintain them and reflect respect for the School brand.

Laundrying and/or dry-cleaning information in relation to each item of school wear can be found on the care labels sewn inside each garment. Care instructions should be strictly adhered to in order to avoid any shrinkage or fading.

Garments that can be laundered should not be washed in concentrate detergents and should be dried in the shade.

Special care should be taken if ironing any item of sportswear. The letters on these garments are sometimes plastisol and will be damaged if not ironed inside out.

13. PERSONAL PRESENTATION

Each student is expected to maintain a high standard of personal appearance appropriate to her age and to the School context.

13.1 MAKEUP

- Students are expected to present at school with no visible make up. If students are wearing make-up they may be asked to remove it.
- False eye-lashes are not permitted. Sampford House girls who have false eyelashes at school will be spoken to, a call will be made home and students will not be allowed to return to school until the eyelashes have been removed. Grant House girls will be sent home.
- Tanning products are discouraged and, if used, should be subtle.

13.2 NAIL POLISH

- Nail polish is not permitted. In the event that a student comes to school wearing nail polish, they will be asked to remove it immediately.
- Acrylic, shellac, SNS, gel or false nails or nail finishes are not permitted. In the event that a student has these products applied for a special occasion, they must be removed before the student returns to school. Sampford House girls who have acrylic, shellac, SNS, gel or false nails or nail finishes at school will be spoken to, a call will be made home and students will not be allowed to return to school until the nail product has been removed. Grant House girls will be sent home.

13.3 JEWELLERY

- Unless specified below, any items of jewellery which fall outside the guidelines will need to be handed in to a staff member and will be returned to the student at the end of the school day.
- The following items of jewellery ONLY are permitted:
 - Kindergarten to Year 9: One small pair of plain round gold or silver stud or sleeper earrings [in earlobes only] provided they are:
 - Unobtrusive
 - Not pearl, gem stone, coloured or patterned.

- Years 10 to 12: No more than two small plain round gold or silver stud or sleeper earrings (in earlobes only) provided they are:
 - Unobtrusive
 - Not pearl, gem stone, coloured or patterned.
- Years 7 to 12 only: A gold or silver plain Christian cross necklace may be worn (with the academic wardrobe only, not with the Sport range) provided it meets the following requirements:
 - the cross is no larger than 3cm in length.
 - the cross carries no embellishments or decorations.
 - the cross is worn on a plain fine linked gold or silver chain.
 - the item is not worn with sportswear or during sport activities.
- A medical alert item, approved by a Medical Practitioner.
- Students are not encouraged to wear jewellery to school. In the event that it is worn, it is the responsibility of the student at all times.
- Students may be asked to remove jewellery if it poses a health and/or safety risk, particularly during sport and physical activity.

13.4 WRISTBANDS, BANGLES AND BRACELETS

- Any kind of wristband, bangle or bracelet* can pose a risk to students and others, particularly during physical activities, PE, sport and playtime, and as such these items cannot be worn by students. This includes chain, beaded, silicone, fabric (or in fact any material) wristbands, bangles and bracelets*. Religious bracelets may not be worn to school.

The only exemption to this is a medical alert item, provided by a Medical Practitioner.

13.5 WATCHES

- Students are encouraged to wear analogue watches to school to assist with their planning and organisation of their school day. They should be worn snugly around the wrist, and not loose like a bracelet. Analogue watches are highly encouraged to assist with student's mathematical development in the concept of time. Watches worn by students should be discreet and plain in colour: black, white or metallic.

Technology that is designed to be used while worn, including smart watches and any wrist-worn device that connects to mobile applications, typically via Bluetooth or wifi, to enhance and extend the functionality of a smartphone, can distract from children's learning. These devices often integrate traditional timekeeping with features such as notifications, health and fitness tracking, and other interactive capabilities. Watches that have these technologies are not permitted to be worn during the school day.

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13.6 PIERCINGS

- The following guidelines apply in relation to piercings:
 - for students who have chosen to acquire visible body piercings other than one in each earlobe (two for students in Years 10, 11 and 12), no studs, keepers, or jewellery of any kind can be worn in these piercings. This includes transparent, opaque, plastic, religious items or items covered by band-aids.
 - girls in Raymond House or Sampford House girls who have such piercings at school will be spoken to, a call will be made home and students will not be allowed to return to school until the piercing has been removed.
 - girls in Grant House who have such piercings will be sent home regardless of whether the piercing can be removed or not.

13.6 HAIR

- Hair must be tied up if it reaches the collar. It is expected to be secured off the face. The following specific guidelines apply:
 - Hair must be neatly styled.
 - It should be of a natural colour.
 - Clips, hair bands and hair ties should be unobtrusive and of a similar colour to the hair.
 - Coloured clips, hair bands, scrunchies, ribbons and hair ties may be worn if they comply with the following guidelines:
 - Kindergarten, Prep and Year 1 - Gold
 - Year 2 to Year 6 - Gold
 - Year 7 to Year 9 - Earlsbrae blue
 - Year 10 to Year 12 - Navy
 - All ribbons, headbands and scrunchies are to be purchased through the School's Wardrobe supplier, Noone Imagewear. These are the only school approved hair accessories.
 - Alligator clips (pictured right) or similar are not permitted.
- For some musical performances or when representing the School **in Sport or** at a special occasion, students may be required/**allowed** to wear a particular colour or style of hair accessory.



13.7 TATTOOS

- There must be no visible tattoos. This includes temporary/henna tattoos or body art.

14. LOWTHER HALL SECONDHAND SHOP

The Second-hand Shop is located in the Noelene Horton Centre (Science building) and is open on Tuesdays between 1.00pm and 4.00pm during school term time only. Entry to the store is via the south side of the building, adjacent to the multipurpose court.

For special opening times during the year, refer to Appendix 8.

BLINKBONNIE HOUSE WARDROBE ITEMS

WARDROBE COORDINATES

- Short Sleeved Polo Shirt (horizontal striped) AND/OR

Blinkbonnie House skivvy's and the short-sleeved polo tops should sit no lower than the hip bone.

COMPULSORY ADDITIONAL ITEMS

- Lowther Hall Bucket Hat

All Blinkbonnie House girls are required to **wear a hat outside** from the beginning of September until the end of April.

- Lowther Hall Art Smock
 - Socks – Plain Navy Anklets (which must cover the ankle bone and be no shorter)
 - Runners which meet the following criteria (refer page 9):
 - supportive
 - non-marking soles
 - predominantly white, black, navy, pale blue or gold
 - School Bathers (Prep and Year 1, Term 4) – Lowther Hall one piece bathers with LH motif OR plain Navy one piece bathers, short sleeve rashie, long sleeve rashie, bike swim shorts or Bermuda swim shorts.
All swimming attire is to be purchased through the School's Wardrobe supplier, Noone Imagewear. These are the only school approved swimwear items.

 - Navy 'Lowther Hall' knitted Beanie
 - Lowther Hall Scarf
 - Navy gloves

SHOES

Blinkbonnie House students are required to wear sport shoes every day. They need to be predominantly white, black, navy, pale blue or gold.



YEARS 2 TO 12 ACADEMIC WARDROBE COMPULSORY

The following are **compulsory**:

- Blazer
 - Navy formal straw hat with Hatband
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YEARS 2 TO 12 ACADEMIC WARDROBE ADDITIONAL

In addition, students should equip themselves with sufficient items to ensure they are ready for various temperatures and activities. Please note guidelines on page 2 regarding the ways in which items can be worn to and from school.

- Dress
- Pinafore (Years 2 to 4) [must be combined with a shirt]
- Skirt – Lowther stripe
- Skirt – Pinstripe (Years 7 to 12)
- Pants
- Shorts – (Years 2 to 10)
- Shirt – Short sleeve
- Shirt – $\frac{3}{4}$ Sleeve
- Jumper
- Vest

Girls must wear **school socks** or **stockings** and may select from the following:

- Tights - Navy Cotton [Not to be worn with shorts]
- Socks – Ribbed Navy Knee High
- Socks – Navy anklet

In addition, girls will require:

- Lowther Hall Art Smock (Year 2 to Year 6)
 - Lab Coat (Years 7 to 10 and Years 11 and 12 science students)
It is an occupational health and safety requirement that all students have a lab coat for practical classes involving chemicals. Each student is expected to own their own lab coat and keep it in their locker for use in practical classes as advised by the teacher. Any student who does not have a Lab Coat to wear in practical classes will not be able to take part in the activity. There will be a small number of Lab Coats belonging to the School available for girls to wear if their Lab Coat is at home.
